9 Minute System – Introduction - Reviewer Sgt Rich

Hi Constables

The hardest thing about reviewing this system is going to be talking about it without revealing what the system is, which wouldn't be fair to the guys who market it.

This isn't a gambling system and definitely isn't a system where one makes selections based upon form or past results and then have a punt on a selection. Neither is it a betting strategy that lays out a procedure to follow with skilled application, requiring judgement.

So what is it? It's more an account balancing exercise, based upon mathematics. It uses the medium of horse racing, but the important things are the odds and playing them to make a profit. It comes from the same guys who developed the All by the Book and the Golden Key Method 2, and carries some similarities in that it is a "playing the odds" system, but is significantly different in nature.

The math's are not too difficult, but are complicated by the Betfair commission, which has to be taken into account. I strongly recommend that you study the system carefully and get your head around it before actually starting it for real. I've seen discussions about this system and it seems it is easily misunderstood by hasty assumptions about how it works.

The mathematics are sound and if you do it correctly then a profit is inevitable. I think it is a great idea (not suggested in the 9 minute system documentation – this is my suggestion) that you "paper trade" until you really have the system sussed. For the first week I will paper trade the races and report my on paper profit/loss. Then I'll go for it for real. You will need an account with a Bookmaker and an Account with either BETFAIR or BETDAQ.

The race selections are very specific. This is not a system for UK racing in general. You place a Back bet with the Bookie and a Lay bet with the betting exchange. Basically one point is bet with the Bookies on a horse up to 14/1. This is important as regards betting bank, because you also lay one point on the exchange to cover the back bet and if the horse is 14/1 the liability is 14 points! You'll see on the advertising page that they talk about £20 bets to make £400 monthly profit. So on a £20 a point basis, your lay liability on a 14/1 is £280! Now you are not "risking" that amount of money so long as your Back and Lay are matched, BUT you do need that amount available in your Bet Exchange account in order to lay the bet. I don't know what your comfortable betting levels are, but this is a significant amount to have riding on one race. And that is why it is vital to understand the system and to get your bets matched.

Of course you don't need to place £20/£280 back/lays, you can use any fraction of that but your monthly profit would also be the same fraction of £400. Another option is to lower your sights so you are not backing horses at such high prices as the recommended maximum of 14/1. But be warned, a situation will arise in the race/horse selection where your options are limited and you may be forced towards backing a horse at prices at the higher end. Anyway we'll get an idea of how these things play out during my review.

So if the maths are sound and the profits are inevitable, then what can go wrong?

1. You can get the maths wrong! So paper trade first until you've got the maths down pat.
2. **Never** place the Lay bet first. Always place the Back bet first so your lay liability is covered by the back bet. The nightmare scenario would be that you lay first and your computer crashes or there is a power cut or your Broadband goes down before you place the back bet! **So Back first then Lay**. If, for some reason you then can't place your lay bet your liability will only be the one point back stake.
3. Either your Back account or your Lay account runs out of funds, paralysing you from covering your bets and balancing the Trade. It is important to realise that time is a factor and the occasion will arise where you have to "get on" to achieve your profit. So you must have enough funds in both accounts.
4. The bookie closes down your account or restricts it because of your success!

The idea is to balance your bets and cream off an inevitable profit. Whatever you're starting positions in both accounts, they will become unbalanced and you will need to transfer funds to restore the correct balance. As the reviews go forward I'll show you how to do this (in case you don't already know) so that the Bookie (hopefully) won't spot you on their radar and restrict your account. But we'll worry about that once we are making our expected profits! There are three variants of the system, as you can see on the sales page. They handle the Betfair commission and the odds taken in slightly different ways, but essentially they have the same basic purpose to cream off a profit on the trade roughly equal to the original one point stake.

As the reviews go forward I'll try to keep all variants going simultaneously and I'll report the actual time taken to compare that against the claimed "9 minutes".

So, based upon maximum possible odds of 14/1 and a basic back stake of 1 point, I'll set up an account with the Bookie of 10 points and a Betfair account of 90 points. That should cover the lays OK as I expect many prices to be well below 14/1. I expect to have to shuffle points from one account to the other to keep the workable ratio.

I'm looking forward to reviewing this novel and interesting system!

Betting Grenade Introduction - Reviewer RM Dave

Hi Blogger's

Its Dave here well this is my 1000th article for BST so I hope it augurs well for Betting Grenade which I shall be reviewing this is another system from the author of BF ATM and Michaels Place Lay Formula. So what is Betting Grenade it is a backing system and you only need BF to place your bets, but you can use ordinary online bookies if you wish although you may find yourself making less profit. If you find a qualifying selection you back it on Betfair and all results shown on the Betting Grenade website are shown to BFSP. The rules are fairly simple you only have 5 to follow the downside of the system is that you have to be at the computer if you have qualifying races. Actually you could use it on the evening racing or just weekends I will be able to give the figures for the weekends only at the end of the review. Due to time difference I will not be able to cover much of the evening racing but I will do my best to cover late afternoon races. The author recommends following the races throughout the day for the best results.

So how much is Betting Grenade? at the moment £69.99 for this you get a 37 page PDF manual thankfully not padded up with how to make a bet etc. Page 1 gives a brief introduction; pages 2 to 19 cover the 5 rules and give plenty of examples of how the system works. Pages 20 and 21 gives the staking plan which is 1 point Level Stakes using a 100 point Starting Bank, also the logic behind the rules is explained in more detail. The author claims that you should be in profit in around 40/45 % of your betting days, given the price of some of the selections one should be prepared to have some longish losing runs but as the author states

this is a long term investment and that you will profit overall. Finally pages 22 to 37 give full results from the 1st of September to October 23rd.

So as per the website the system made 113.10 points profit in October, plus 37.20 points in October and so far in November it is 1.86 points ahead. The author provided me with a video as well showing the system in operation although as I said the rules are easy to follow. So to sum up we have an easy to understand system that backs some good price winners, straightforward backing at BFSP; the downside is you have to be at your computer to follow the racing, although having said that you can determine in advance what races you might be backing in, but you could miss out on some additional races if circumstances changed within those races you excluded that could make them possible qualifiers. Other thing is be prepared for losing runs and remember it is supposed to be a long term investment, So on with the trial let us see what the next 56 or 84 days brings forth - will the grenade blow our bank or give us explosive profits?

Deja Vu Football Introduction - Reviewer RM Dave

Hi Blogger's

Its Dave here formerly Sgt Dave most of you regulars will know me by now, I will be reviewing a football service by Dennis Young and which is being promoted by Steve Davidson. I have actually been using this myself since early October and the service has made a profit of 143 points if you managed to secure the Best Odds available.

So what is Deja Vu Football it is a service that aims to give the correct score in selected matches from the English Premiership, Scottish Premiership and the German Bundesliga. For each match four possible scores are given or as per the sales page 4 micro bets. On average you would have around 6 to 12 selected matches at the weekend spread over the Saturday and Sunday, you do have midweek matches as well, I had a couple of matches on a Monday and Friday too. I found e-mails to arrive in good time allowing a few days before the actual matches kick off, also you have password protected members area which also lists the selections and gives past results which I am pleased to report are bang up to date.

The only results we have for last season are from 6th February to May 9th and the service had 75 selected matches of which it correctly gave the score in 26 of those and made a profit of 135.7 points. For the current season as mentioned earlier a profit of 143 points has been made this was from a total of 76 games of which the service has given the correct score in 30 of them.

I will be posting the results from November 6th onwards actually it gives a good idea of the service because it can have a period of bad results and just one or two correct scores and its in profit. Now being that you will be staking a reasonable amount say 48 bets at 1 point per micro bet or correct score giving a total stake of 48 points, I will use a starting bank of 500 points I will contact Dennis and see if he has any particular thoughts on this. To obtain the best possible prices I will use Oddschecker and look at both bookies and exchanges prices, remember for higher scores exchanges just gives one price and call them Any Unquoted so if

we take the Chelsea - Sunderland game on Sunday any score over 3-3 is given odds of 4.3 with Bf so if you wanted to back Chelsea to win 4-2 all you would get from them is the odds of

4.3 where the best price from the bookies is 67.0. So in the case of high scores I will be looking at the best bookie odds for those.

So how much does the service cost? £45.00 per month on an auto rebilling which can be cancelled at anytime or the best deal if you think this kind of service is for you is the £177.00 for the whole football season this works at around £30.00 per month if you took that subscription out now. Payments are made through Paypal so your internet transaction is safe.

From what I have seen of the service so far it looks good, no problems with e-mails, no problem accessing members area, results are updated quickly and making a profit but we shall see what the full review brings. It should be stated that the aim of the service is to provide steady profits over a period of time it is not a get rich now product as we all know those ones should be labeled get poor now!. If you want to wring the extra profit from getting the best odds and of course placing all the different scores it will take up some of your time probably around 1 to 2 hours a week depending on the number of matches given, anyway on with the review.

Sam's Lucky 9 Lays Introduction - Reviewer Sgt Ian

Hello all, I am back and ready to give Sam's Lucky 9 Lays the renowned BST going over. It's been a while since I last reviewed anything. I have been so busy with family and other commitments I have been unable to make any time available.

I have been provided with a new email address by Richard, so if you need to speak to me about anything, post it to this section or email me on ianmorris@bettingsystemtruths.com. If the questions are with regard to this review, I for one would prefer you posted to this section for all to see, but by all means back that up with an email also.

Sam's Lucky 9 Lays is what it says on the tin really. Its author is named Sam, it's a laying service. The number 9 represents the max odds permitted by the system. The service uses BFSP, so you can easily set this up around 10am using the SP function on BF and go about your business for the day. Please be aware though that this function is not perfect, if there is a suspension prior to the off (such as a horse withdrawal) your bet is liable to cancellation, so a frequent check might be in order.

Onto the sales page, well it's a no fluff no hype affair, which is refreshing to say the least. The service costs £9.99 weekly, and looking at the past results you will get 1-2 selections daily, there will be no betting days. As this is the case I will base my review on 56 or 84 actual betting days. The service is promoted and maintained by Betfan, you get access to the Bet Management Service via login credentials that will be supplied to you after purchase. This is backed up by a daily email which will state the selections for the day.

We had a few problems sorting out access for myself yesterday, these issues were quickly sorted out in a professional manner and my access was granted very much in time for the days racing. So a good start on the customer service side of things.

No information was provided with regard to any manual advising bank level or any staking plan. Given that I will be applying two simple staking methods, both of which will have a 150pt bank applied to them. I think it is almost universally accepted that a 150pt bank is the minimum advisable when laying.

Staking plan 1 – 1pt level stake

Staking plan 2 – 1pt liability

The action kicked off yesterday so look out for my Day 1 review posting.

The first of our new reviews to have actual results it all started well with 6 correct scores given for the 9 matches on Day 1, but after that it went a bit wrong with a couple of days being wipeouts. So from the 30 matches given from Days 1 to 9 the service gave the correct score in 8 of them which is a 26.67% strike rate but if you take in to account that you are actually placing 4 bets per match this could be reduced to 6.66%., Having said all that the service has performed a lot better in the past than it has for the review so far, yet despite a poor start it is still 8.2 points up but cannot afford anymore weekends like the 13th and 14th (Days 8/9) or the bank will soon drop.

Blogger's Corner

Pleased to say we have two contributions for the Blogger's Corner this week thank you to the readers who sent them, the first I suggest you all read as it is quite worrying.

Posting Number 1

Hi All

I've just had a terrible experience with Betfair & I think you & your subscribers ought to know about.

Briefly, I have used Betfair for 10 years & have had no problems when accessing via my "firewalled" laptop. I've been using the Betfair mobile facility (betting via your mobile phone) for approx 3 years and had no problems....until a few weeks ago. A fraudster picked up my logon details via (I assume) some form of tracking software because there's no firewall on your mobile. Since they could not take my funds directly as they would have had to register a card (and thus leave an audit trail etc), they simply placed a frivolous bet on some Italian football match.....and I was £2k out of pocket.

When I complained repeatedly to Betfair, their response was basically tough luck ! You were negligent in the use of your login details, the bet was matched in good faith, the other person logged in first time (thus I must have given the details away) & finally their standard T & Cs state you have to protect your details etc. They refused to refund my money stating would I have complained if the bet had won etc.

So, I have had to close that account. I have also tried to find a firewall protection for my mobile, but I cannot find any.....and this is where my warning is particularly appropriate. Betfair actively promote this "mobile betting facility", but there appears to be nothing to stop other users suffering repeat incidents like mine.

So, going forward, I still use this facility (albeit a lot less) & the lessons I have learnt are.....

- a) Keep your balance as low as possible in your betting accounts (if only to minimise the loss of future repeats).
- b) If you do have a big win via your mobile, get the funds out of the account ASAP.

c) Don't share your account details with anyone

Keep up your good work.

Posting Number 2

Hi

I am e-mailing in response to your testing of the Fisher Roulette system. As usual I read your newsletter with interest. It helps with some of the betting systems that I have tried /am trying. You recommended Betfair Pirate, so I gave it a go, and wished I hadn't. So I resolved to leave horse racing well alone after many years, many systems, and much lost money.

So I was surprised a couple of weeks ago, scrolling down the systems and I came to an abrupt halt, because I spotted Fisher Roulette System, and saw the points that had been accrued. I thought whoa we might as well all pack up and go home and forget horse racing and just do this. So I bought the system, waded through it, got stuck in and made 50 points. I was already spending in my mind the two grand a week. Fan bloody tastic, doubled my stakes and blew out 150 points, Burnt fingers syndrome.

Put it back in the box, and thought if it looks too good to be true.....I always thought to myself, whose money am I winning, and how long before they realise and change it. Because, I think they have an adviser who watches over you, to make sure you don't win too much. Then I read your next news letter that Sgt Tommy had burned and crashed. But I suppose the question is where did the reviewer go wrong, how many spins per coup did he get to before he gave up like me? I got one where including the first two free spins; I was up to 11 spins and no win. And looking at one of the video examples from the author he got up to about 130 times the original stake i.e. for £ 1 basic stake he had to bet £ 130 to win his money back. It's alright saying the system will always pull it back but at what price. I think the system can be made to work but you've got to keep the stake small, use multiple casinos, and keep under their radar. Nobody likes losing money and I don't suppose they're different to anyone else.

Racing Personality

Following on from the AP Mc Coy article in BST newsletter Edition 23 we have a short piece on his employer JP Mc Manus.



J P McManus

All racing fans must be familiar with the famous McManus racing colours. Race after race, we see a jockey wearing the famous green silks with gold hoops.

No sooner has the jockey A P McCoy won a race on a McManus owned horse, then we see the next race, from another track, with another McManus runner. Then we watch an Irish race and there are *three* horses wearing the McManus colours! Only to return to a race with A P riding another McManus horse and a second jockey riding a

second-string horse in the same race!

Yet apart from the name, the colours and the rides of A P McCoy, possibly few punters have much knowledge of the owner who seems to stay in the background, these days.



John Patrick "J. P." McManus was born in 1951 in Limerick. He started as an on-course greyhound bookmaker. His first owned horse was Cill Dara and now he has over 400 horses in training!

He owns a stud farm in Limerick and counts among his friends, John Francome, Peter O'Sullivan, Tiger Woods and John Magnier with whom he owned nearly 30% of Manchester United before they sold to Malcolm Glazier!

Although he made much of his £2 billion fortune trading the foreign exchanges, he is well-known for huge bets on racing. In March 2006 he won over £1 million from Cheltenham bookmaker "Fearless" Freddie Williams! These days he "rarely bets".

He provides charitable scholarships to Limerick schoolchildren and organises the Limerick Pro-Am Invitation golf tournament to raise money for local charities. He is currently receiving treatment for Cancer in the USA and reportedly doing well.

So next time you watch McCoy ride yet another winner in the green and gold, you will have some background information to the story.
