Being as Sgt Rob done such a good job on this review I have copied it in its entirety as it would be difficult to explain the angles that Sgt Rob was using without all his tables to back it up.

Layers of Profit (Mk II) - Reviewer Sgt Rob

The Service

Layers Of Profit is an email based tips service for laying horses on the betting exchanges. You receive one selection per day which is emailed almost without fail at 11.45 a.m. UK time. You

are advised to lay the selection at odds of 4.0 maximum. Initially, I took this to the exact letter and only recorded results for horses that started at this price or lower. Because I was tracking

the in-running price of the selections, I could also provide data for horses that reached 4.0 or lower – more on that to come. The Layers of Profit system owner advised a 35 pt starting bank, and I laid each selection for 1 pt on Betfair, aiming to win 0.95 pts for a successful lay after normal Betfair commission of 5%.

What do you mean by Mk II?

Layers of Profit has been reviewed twice by myself. The first version provided up to six selections a day and the ceiling for placing bets was 6.0 on the exchanges. This version stopped suddenly when the system owner had personal problems – at the time, the system had recovered to a -4 pts loss overall when it had been in the -18 pt loss territory.

When the system owner resumed the service, he introduced the new rules of 1 selection a day and lowered the betting ceiling to 4.0. He asked if we could re-trial Layers of Profit from scratch with the new service, which after discussion with The Commissioner, we agreed to. So Layers of Profit Mk II relates to the new 'slimline' service. If you choose to purchase the product, it is still called Layers of Profit, from the same owner, from the same domain – I merely added Mk II in my posts to differentiate between the two reviews.

What about some statistics?

As I alluded to in an earlier comment, I quite literally took 4.0 or lower as the criteria for recording bets. This is referred to in the 'Main' row...38 selections started at 4.0 or lower, 33 of them duly lost the race for a profit of 19.97 pts and a strike rate of 86.84 %

But what struck me soon after I started the Layers of Profit review was that I could request odds of 4.0 from Betfair with 3 possible outcomes:

- i) Bet matched straight away as price lower than 4.0
- ii) Bet not matched but kept in-running and then matched in running
- iii) Bet not matched but kept in running and not matched.

So I created a row for '4.0' which showed that from i) and ii) above, 70 selections were available to be matched before/in-running at 4.0 or lower, 61 were winning selections for us with a profit of 34.57 pts and a strike rate of 87.14% – this is a far better way of using the advice given, but as I started the Layers Of Profit review in a different way, I kept on doing it that way!

The 'Any' column is what it says on the tin – take any selection and lay it at the price it currently is on the exchange, providing 82 selections with 73 winning bets for us, a profit of 42.12 pts and a strike rate of 89.02%. The other values were randomly chosen by me, I wanted to see how low some of the selections went and if there was any profitability using lower odds than 4.0.

General Statistics

In the 84 days (that lasted from July 12th thru 3rd Oct) there were 84 selections of which 2 were non runners, so the information above is calculated from 82 selections. Overall there were 9 winning horses (losers for us) at Betfair Starting Prices of 2.74, 3.35, 3.4, 4.54, 3.09, 5.3, 5.6, 3.62 and 4.3 (an average of 3.99). There were 3 winners (losers for us) in a 6 day period, but that was as bad as it got, no consecutive winners (losers for us). Longest winning run was 18 days (although on 2 of these days the price only dropped to 4.2 and 5.0 in-running) and at the end of the trial, the Layers Of Profit service had notched up 16 straight successful lays (although 5 failed to drop below 4.0 offering a low in-running of 4.1, 5.1, 4.1, 4.6 and 5.1). The average Betfair Starting Price of the 82 selections that ran was 4.33. Show me the money statistics

So lets look at how different betting banks would have fared (using the 35 pt starting bank principle):

This table shows how the betting bank would have ended up using different lay amounts of £10, £20, £50 or £100.

As an example, using the '4.0' row, if I had requested odds of 4.0 (either matched straight away, or kept in-running), laying each selection at £20 would have seen the final bank balance at £1391.40 – a profit of £691.40 after my £700 starting bank (£20 times 35 pts) had been deducted

Representing that table in terms of clear profit i.e. deducting the starting bank from the above table:

So here, if we use the '4.0' row at £10 stakes I have made £345.70 clear profit.

Of course, you do have to pay for the Layers of Profit service. The trial was done over 84 days which equates to 3 months of subscriptions. If I round up the £19.99 monthly subscription fee to £20 (for simplicity), let's look at the clear profit after deducting 3 months subscriptions (e.g. using our profits to pay for the system):

So here, if you were lucky to be playing with £100 stakes and laid every selection at £100 (regardless of price), after paying for the system with your winnings, you would still be up by £4,152.

The Verdict?

One final table that is combination of some of the above data: it shows clear profit after subscription fees deducted (i.e. paid for from our winnings) with the original basic stats for the system.

From this we can see that at all levels shown, the system has paid for itself. Betting at 3.6, 4.0 and 5.0 (matched before if available, or taken in-running) or betting any selection at BFSP all produce an excellent strike rate in excess of 85%.

Is Layers of Profit for everyone? Well, for those of you that can't access your email account between 11.45 a.m. UK time (when the selection comes out) and race start time, then I would say not! Also, those looking for just one system to make them rich, then again, not – we only get one selection a day so those people will look elsewhere for that elusive Holy Grail. What I can say is that the new slimline Layers of Profit service does what it says on the tin. It has provided profits across the board and is at the very least an excellent addition to any portfolio of systems you may have. For those of you that feel inspired to subscribe to LOP, then my recommendation is to take the 4.0, 5.0 or any options and progress from there

In conclusion, Layers of Profits is deemed Passed with a rating of 4.5 stars.

Software Review

Here we have greyhound grader software that was due to be reviewed by Sgt Rob but because of time constraints he was not able to do the Full 56 or 84 day review but he has given an introduction and review summary all in one.

Greyhound Race Grader Software - Introduction and Summary - By Sgt Rob

The Commissioner asked me to have a look at the Greyhound Race Grader (from now on known as GRG) I have decided (in consultation with him above) not to review this for the 56/84 day period for reasons that will be made clear below. I did manage to analyse some of the races over a two day period and I will offer some statistics at the end.

So what is the GRG?

The GRG is a software application that is downloaded onto your PC via a zip file, and once registered via a code supplied by the system owner, runs as a standalone program. The system costs £28 and is available via Clickbank purchase.

The GRG allows you to grade/rate all greyhound races in the UK for the day using 2 different filters: i) Any measurable race grade or ii) Same history grade group as race grade group.

Or, to explain, for i) it will analyze the greyhound's previous races irrespective of grade (e.g. whether it was an A5/T3 race etc and for ii) If the current race is A3, it will only analyze races that began with A and ignore any races that aren't in that grade.

The results for each greyhound's last 5 races are used for analysis but the grader works to a lowest common denominator, e.g.:

HP races cannot be rated by the grader. So, from the 6 greyhounds (that all have 5 race history), if the greyhound in Trap 3 has run a HP race in it's last 5 races, then the grader will only use a 4 race history for it's analysis. If Trap 3 has run 3 HP races in its last 5 races, then the grader will only use 2 race history for its analysis.

Once graded the results are shown with each greyhound allocated a points score, the higher being the best graded greyhound. The GRG also provides a dutching calculator where you can manually enter the odds of greyhounds you are interested in backing with your profit target and it will calculate the software accordingly. For those of you that want to have a sneak peek at the software in action, you can have a look at the video available from the link on the BST website.

How do I use the software to grade a race?

You select the race and time from two drop down menus and GRG will bring up the race. You then choose which grading method (any/same) and then click on the 'prepare forecast'

button. If you then want to grade via the other option, you need to click on the 'race selection' button, choose the other grading method and click 'prepare forecast' once more. Once you've graded a race, you can save it to a file on your computer and load it up later.

So what are my thoughts on the GRG?

Well, the software is very easy to use and very quick. I did find it frustrating, after grading a race via the Any method, having to click to the race selection screen to return back to the selections in order to change the grading option to Same to prepare another grading for the same race, although you do get in a bit of a rhythm after a while!

I would also have liked an option to grade all the races in a day via both methods and be able to print off a report with these on for further analysis. But this is not available; you have to manually grade each race via both methods...I then found myself writing down the selections, then grading the next race, writing it down and so forth. Also, with the dutching calculator, it is worth noting that you need to enter the odds manually. This is not me making a negative point, but I just wanted to point out that there is no automation of any sort with Betfair etc.

So why aren't you reviewing this for 56/84 days?

I found that it took about 2 minutes for me to grade a race via both methods and to write down the grading results on a piece of paper. I make it there are about 10 meetings a day with 12 races each. So 120 races times 2 minutes = 240 minutes, or 4 hours. The races start about 11 a.m. and can finish near 11 p.m. so, the way I was doing it, meant I was never going to be able to do it all and fit in 9 hours of train driving as well as my other commitments.

People with more time on their hands, or people that might only be interested in specific meetings/races, or even people who don't document all the ratings onto a piece of paper the way I did might fare a lot better.

So what did you do?

I managed to grade two meetings on Monday September 28th and two more on Tuesday September 29th. This gave me 48 races worth of data to analyse. Of course this is only 20% of the data for each day so is merely a subset (which is why this is a summary post and not a review), but there was enough information to spot a couple of positive trends. With my 48 race data, I then filtered out some races as follows:

- i) Where the Any/Same gradings produced exactly the same results (e.g. if all 6 greyhound's 5 previous races had been A grade race, the Any/Same grading's can't be different.
- ii) Where the Any or Same races produced a joint-highest graded greyhound. E.g. the 13.12 at Sheffield on the Monday said that for the Any grading, greyhounds 2 and 3 tied on 47 points.

So I was interested in looking at races where the GRG had produced a clear top-rated greyhound in each race where the Any/Same ratings weren't identical. That was my preference. This narrowed the 48 races down to 18 races.

And so for some statistics

Possibly a cardinal sin here, but results below will show ISP and not Betfair prices. As it an overview, hopefully I won't get in trouble So, 18 races...

Option 1) Backing the Any top-graded selection: 18 races, 1 winner at 9/2, 5 places at 2/1, 9/8, 9/8 and 11/16 (based on 1/4 odds the first 2).

Option 2) Backing the Same top-graded selection: 18 races, 3 winners at 4/1, 7/2 and 4/1. 6 places at Evens, 5/8, 3/8, 7/8, 11/16 and Evens.

Option 3) Backing the top-graded selection where Any = Same : 7 races, 1 place at 11/16 Option 4) Forecasting – Back the top-graded selection for Any with the top-graded selection for Same where Any and Same are different. 11 races, 2 forecast winners paying £16.68 and £36.44 to £1 stakes. Do these 7 races as a £1 reverse forecast would give a £33.12 profit.

Option 5) Lay the Any selection: 18 races, 1 winner at 9/2 but 17 selections lost

Option 6) Lay the Same selection: 18 races, 3 winners, at 4/1, 7/2 and 4/1. 15 selections lost Option 7) Lay the top-graded selection where the Any and Same selection match: 7 races no winning greyhounds so 7 winning bets for us.

So to summarise

I want to repeat that the above analysis was done using only a 20% sample of the day's greyhound racing so to make any iron-cast assumptions would be unfair. Further to that, I then used my own filters to narrow down the selections to a maximum of 18.

So from that very small subset, I couldn't seem to make a profit backing the selections. But Laying the Any selection (when it was different to the Same selection) was profitable, as was laying the top-graded greyhound where Any = Same.

Also, forecasting was interesting, you don't need many of those to show a profit. It may seem odd that I am advocating laying top-graded selections, this could be because my data subset is so small it has become distorted. Then again, if a system works or looks profitable, then go with the flow!

And finally

I can't help but feel the GRG just needs an option to grade all the races of the day in one go and let you print out the results as it doesn't do that, I found there was a fair bit of work involved getting the race information down on paper in a way that I would like it formatted. However, even with a small subset of data, there does seem to be more than 1 way to use this software so potentially it could be lucrative. My recommendation is that if you are curious, then buy it, it comes via clickbank so has a solid refunds policy. I suspect that it could be used to generate a profit but you will need to set some time aside to grade the races
